**YOUTHBUILD RECEIVES DONATION OF 2,100 COMPUTERS FOR
STUDENT REFURBISHING PROGRAM**

Refurbishing Will Kick Off as Part of Martin Luther King Day of Service Activities

Philadelphia, Jan. 4, 2007 –YouthBuild Philadelphia Charter School is to be the recipient of 2,100 used laptop computers, donated by Wyeth – a world leader in research-driven pharmaceutical and health care products – for YouthBuild’s computer training and refurbishing program. YouthBuild technology students will take the donated computers through every phase of the refurbishing process and distribute the computers back into the community.

YouthBuild’s technology program provides 32 students per year with industry-recognized hardware and software training that facilitates entry into the computer technology field. As part of the program, students acquire excess computers from local and national businesses, perform diagnostic evaluations, complete necessary repairs, and install refurbished computers into qualified, underserved organizations and schools. YouthBuild has refurbished more than 1,200 computers since the inception of its technology program four years ago.

Wyeth partnered with Redemtech, a leading provider of Technology Change Management (TCM) services, in order to ensure efficient and proper asset recovery for the donated computers. Redemtech offered free services to Wyeth as part of Redemtech’s new TakeBack Program to assist charitable organizations that receive donated technology from the company’s clients.

"Deeply committed to serving our local communities, Wyeth is pleased to be able to provide 2,100 used laptop computers to YouthBuild," said Diana Blankman, Wyeth’s Director of Corporate Contributions and Community Outreach. "Working in partnership with Redemtech, we hope that this donation will provide YouthBuild and its students with a broader range of tools, adding to the outstanding support and opportunities that this organization currently provides to out-of-school youth in Philadelphia."

The donation from Wyeth will kick off on Jan. 15, 2007 during the 12th Annual Martin Luther King Day of Service at Martin Luther King High School. Students will train a pre-designated group of low-income community members in basic computer skills, and each of the trainees will receive a refurbished laptop. The rest of the laptops will be restored and distributed in the city over the next several years.

“Wyeth’s donation will impact not only our school, but thousands of people in the Philadelphia area,” said Brian Leffler, Director of Program Development and Technology Training for YouthBuild. “The laptops will help to ensure that YouthBuild continues to provide quality skills and career training to students, and in turn, provide students with opportunities to contribute incredible services to the local communities.”
