SINCE 1992, YOUTHBUILD PHILADELPHIA STUDENTS HAVE:

- REHABILITATED **65 HOMES** FOR LOW-INCOME FAMILIES;
- REFURBISHED MORE THAN **2,000 COMPUTERS**;
- NURSED PEOPLE IN **LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES**; AND,
- DONATED **THOUSANDS** OF OTHER **VOLUNTEER HOURS**.

2006-07: Provided a year of service in Nicetown including the construction of a curfew center, park beautification, tree planting, and the coordination of "Operation P.E.A.C.E." - a free community concert and civic awareness event.



2007: Refurbished hundreds of laptops, which were distributed to low-income community members after a training session during the Martin Luther King Day of Service.



2004: Beautified lots, planted gardens and painted recreation equipment at eight sites for the Make A Difference Day "German-town Beautification Project."



2007-08: YouthBuild is currently rehabilitating three historic homes in North Philadelphia. The projects are scheduled for completion in 2008.



YouthBuild was commended for its personalized school culture during a 2006 visit by the Gates Foundation.

2000-01: Restored habitats and trails, constructed office space, and beautified grounds at the Schuylkill Center for Environmental Education.



YouthBuild students have refurbished thousands of computers for more than 50 local organizations.

1996-97: Coordinated a recycling project in three neighborhoods, resulting in the collection of more than 14.35 tons of paper, plastics and textiles in the first year alone.



2006/07: Provided more than 1,600 hours of care to residents in Park Pleasant Nursing Home while training to become Certified Nurse Assistants.

1993: Rehabilitated a house on South Ringgold Street - the first of YouthBuild's many construction projects.



YouthBuild students have completed more than 85 housing rehabs and renovations in the city of Philadelphia.

1996: Rehabilitated five houses on Montrose Street. The projects earned a visit from the First Lady of the United States.

1998: Assisted Houston Energy Center in the design/construction of eight picnic and playground areas in previously vacant lots.

1997-2000: Provided classroom support, after-school programs, extracurriculars, and grounds beautification during a four-year "Adopt-a-Community" project at Nebinger Elementary School. The program was visited by the President and First Lady of the United States in 1997.



2000: Constructed a home on Oxford Street with an accessibility ramp for individuals with physical disabilities. The home was one of fourteen completed in 2000.



2007: Assisted in organizing the 2007 Future Leaders' Mayoral Forum. Student Analicia Lindsay-Wilson introduced candidate Michael Nutter.



2007: Led volunteers from around the country in constructing a house frame, which was shipped to Gulfport, Miss. for the "YouthBuild AmeriCorps Katrina Rebuilding Project."



More than 1,400 young people have completed the program, 86% of whom earned high school diplomas.
